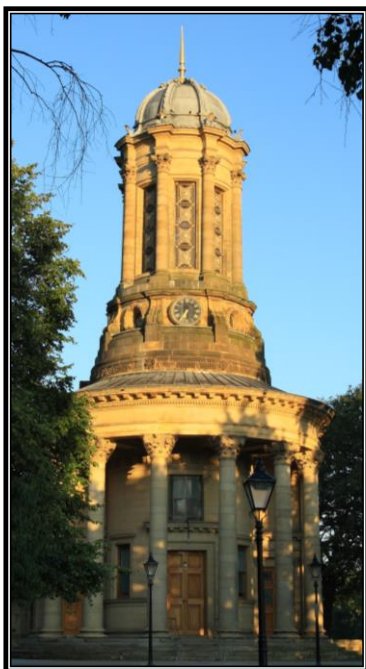

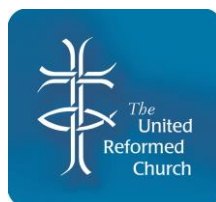

Like Father, Like Son

Our services are children-friendly, with a **Sunday School** for very young children and their carers, which starts after the first 20 minutes of the service.

Coffee and Tea are served after each Sunday service in the downstairs rooms. **Please do join us.**

If you wish to discuss a **wedding or christening**, please see one of the authorized persons at the front desk after a Sunday service.

'Dead Ringer' is the odd phrase we use when referring to someone who looks like somebody else. Sometimes, instead, we say 'spitting image' when we see a likeness or similarity between one person and another.

This month includes Fathers' Day (15th June) and is an occasion when dads are particularly remembered by their children. As far as the boys are concerned, how many have heard someone say 'Oh, you really look like your father'?

One day, Jesus was talking to His disciples and said "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn 14:9) What an amazing statement! Jesus was saying that he was the dead ringer or spitting image of God! At another time Jesus said "I am in the Father and the Father is in me." (Jn 14.10) These words must have shocked his hearers, for he was saying that he was equal with God. No one had said anything like this before, but certainly his miracles were proof that he was different. No-one else could do what he was doing. Some people wondered—could he really be who he said he was?

So Jesus attempted to make his position clear and said "If you knew me you would know the Father also." (Jn 8:19) The people were being urged to know Jesus more. They had to look, listen and believe. Were his deeds of God or not? They had to decide!

Today, we all stand in a similar position. Who is Jesus? Do we look at him and say 'Yes, this is God in the flesh' or 'No, he was just a good person — but also perhaps, deluded or crazy?'

Thomas, the disciple with the nickname 'doubter', exclaimed: "My Lord and my God" (Jn 20:28) Thomas was convinced that he was in the presence of God, in human form. And when the Apostle Paul wrote to the church at Colossae he said clearly: 'It was by God's own decision that the Son has in himself the full nature of God' (Colossians 1:19). Like Father, like Son!

JARS FOR NEPAL

Four years ago in 2010 I joined a team of scout leaders from all over West Yorkshire on a trip to Nepal to build a community schoolroom high up in the Himalayas.

This was done in conjunction with CAN (Community Action Nepal) which is a charity carrying out vital projects in remote villages in Nepal, for example setting up and maintaining health posts, schools and hostels (see www.canepal.org.uk).

CAN was founded by Doug Scott CBE who was the first British mountaineer to climb Everest in 1975 with his partner Dougal Haston. After this expedition he soon realised that vital charity work was needed when he witnessed the poor conditions there. This has carried on to this day.

Next Year I have the opportunity to join a team of 25 men and women who will be travelling to the same region for maintenance work in three villages. As this is a voluntary organisation it has to be funded by each person.

It is my aim to raise enough money to make the journey possible for me. The cost includes flights, accommodation, porters and building materials/tools and of course insurance.

Therefore, I intend to sell lots of marmalade to family and friends. However, to do this I need jars! If you could please save me your glass jam/marmalade/honey jars (with screw-top lids) I would be extremely grateful. Any jars that have contained spices or pickles are not suitable as the taste/smell cannot be fully removed.

I will be at church most Sundays and thank you in anticipation.
